Candidates face off with sharply contrasting views on human life

The Pennsylvania Pro-Life Federation PAC has released a comprehensive Voter Guide for the 2020 general election. The guide is based on the candidatesøvoting records and public statements, compiled by the Federation, often with the assistance of local pro-life groups like People for Life.

A candidate who is identified as pro-life is one who supports legislation and public policies that will protect prenatal children and supports caring alternatives to abortion. A candidate who is identified as pro-abortion is one who will not support legislation or public policies that protect prenatal children. A candidate@s position on abortion usually reflects his or her positions on other key human life issues such as assisted suicide, euthanasia, and infanticide.

Abortion is a tremendously important human rights issue for voters, especially because of the magnitude of the tragedy: Nearly a million American children have their lives ended by abortion every year.

Here is what the Federation PAC has to say about the candidates who are on the ballot in northwestern Pennsylvania for the November 3 general election.

FEDERAL RACES In the Presidential race, Donald Trump & Mike Pence (R) are pro-life; Joe Biden & Kamala Harris (D) are pro-abortion. In the 16th Congressional District, Mike Kelly (R) is pro-life; Kristy

Gnibus (D) is pro-abortion. In the 15th Congressional District, Glenn Thompson (R) is pro-life; Robert Williams (D) is proabortion.

STATEWIDE RACES In the race for state Attorney General, Heather Heidelbaugh (R) is pro-life; Josh Shapiro (D) is pro-abortion. In the race for state Auditor General, Tim Defoor (R) is pro-life: Nina Ahmad (D) is pro-abortion. In the race for state Treasurer, Stacy Garrity (R) is pro-life; Joe Torsella (D) is pro-abortion.

PA STATE SENATE In the 49th District, Dan Laughlin (R) has a mixed record; Julie Slomski (D) is pro-abortion.

PA HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES In

the 1st District, Pat Harkins (D), running unopposed, is pro-abortion. In the 2nd District, Bob Merski (D), running unopposed, is pro-abortion. In the 3rd District, Greg Hayes (R) is pro-life; Ryan Bizzarro (D) is pro-abortion. In the 4th District, Curt Sonney (R), running unopposed, is pro-life. In the 6th District, Brad Roae (R) is pro-life; Matthew Ferrence (D) is listed, position unknown. In the 7th District, Mark Longietti (D), running unopposed, is pro-life. In the 17th District, Parke Wentling (R), running unopposed, is pro-life. In 65th District, Kathy Rapp (R), running unopposed, is pro-life.

BIRDS OF A FEATHER Another way to learn about the candidatesøposition on human life issues is to see who their friends are. An endorsement from a pro-abortion organization indicates the highest level of confidence that the candidate will advance the pro-abortion agenda.

In the current election cycle, Julie Slomski (D), running in state Senate District 49 against incumbent Dan Laughlin (R), is one of only 11 state Senate candidates who are endorsed by Planned Parenthood (the largest abortion provider in the United States). She is also endorsed by Emilyøs List, a political action committee dedicated exclusively to electing pro-abortion women.

Nina Ahmad (D), running for state Auditor General, is endorsed by Emilyøs List and the pro-abortion National Organization for Women.

Kristy Gnibus (D), running in the 16th District Congressional District against prolife Mike Kelly, is endorsed by the National Organization for Women.

The Biden-Harris presidential ticket is endorsed, as you might expect, by Planned Parenthood, NARAL and NOW. Additionally, Kamala Harris is endorsed by Emilyøs List, which only endorses proabortion females.

Political Convention Most Pro-Life

Describing President Trump as othe most prolife presidentö seemed like optimistic hyperbole not so long ago, but the title gradually became axiomatic within the prolife community. By all legitimate measurements, Donald Trump has indeed earned the distinction of being the most prolife president America has ever seen. No one should have been surprised, then, that the Republican National Convention, August 24-27 was the most pro-life political party convention that America has ever seen.

Abby Johnson, a former Planned Parenthood abortion facility director, spoke candidly about the horror of the abortion procedure, describing a sonogram of the unborn child fighting to escape the surgical instruments and the babyøs õspine twirling around in the mother wombö in the final moments of the procedure.

Sister Deirdre Byrne, a former military surgeon and U.S. Army Colonel, declared that õWe must fight against a legislative agenda that supports and even celebrates destroying life in the womb,ö correctly

warning that the Biden-Harris ticket is the õmost anti-life ever... even supporting the horrors of late-term abortion and infanticide.ö

Cabinet Secretary Ben Carson deplored õthe fact that African Americans have the highest abortion rate.ö

Nick Sandman talked about becoming the target of the õfull war machine of the mainstream media,ö primarily because he attended the March for Life and wore a MAGA hat.

And there were these stirring words from President Trump himself, õTonight we

Our special guest speaker will be Rachel Bovard, Senior Director of Policy at the Conservative Partnership Institute in Washington, DC.

Rachel is a native of the Finger Lakes region, born and raised in Dansville, New York a little south of Rochester. She studied history and political science at Grove City College, graduating summa cum laude in 2006. She also earned a masterøs degree

from the Graduate School of Political Management at George Washington University.

Rachel was highly recommended by Dr. Paul Kengor, one of her professors at Grove City. Dr. Kengor was the guest speaker at our 2015 Pro-Life Breakfast.

Beginning in 2006, Rachel served in the U.S. House and Senate in various roles, including legislative director for Senator Rand Paul. In 2013 she was named one of Washington DC most influential women under 35 by *National Journal*.

Rachelos writing has appeared in many prominent publications, and she has made multiple radio and television appearances on: MSNBC, CNBC, Fox Business, EWTN, NPR, and other venues.

March for Life Bus Trip

The 2021 Washington, DC March for Life has been pushed back to Friday, January 29 because of the presidential inauguration, which will take place on Wednesday, January 20. People for Life has three buses ready to go, so please start making plans to join us.

Our Bus Trip is designed to be economical in terms of both time and money. The entire trip takes only about 26 hours, and seats are still only \$55. Pay by December 26 and receive a \$5 subsidy as a thank you. Early reservations help us decide if we have chartered the correct number of buses. Online reservations will be available in early November. Payments can also be made at our office or by mail.

MFL Bus Sponsorships

We work very hard each year to send as many people and buses as possible to the March for Life. We do all we can to make the March for Life experience available to everyone: by relying on as many people as possible to pay their own way and by encouraging others, who are able, to help those on tight budgets, students and young families for instance, with the cost of their seats. A donation of \$55 will cover the full cost of one seat or allow two marchers to get their seats at half-price. Smaller donations help, too.

In addition to the cost of a seat, marchers are responsible for their own meals and Metro fare (about \$10).

Surviving COVID-19

We hope you and your family have been staying safe during the COVID-19 crisis. That has thankfully been the case with your People for Life leadership and the organization@s close contacts and volunteers.

We are happy to report that People for Life has been surviving economically, but not without extra help from our friends. We did avoid some significant expenditures, because the dozen or so community events where we normally conduct educational outreach were all cancelled. It is assumed sometimes that our pro-life booths generate income, but that is not at all the case.

The time we would have devoted to the pro-life booths was, instead, spent reaching out to our friends and asking for their financial support, to make up some major budget shortfalls.

Our most important annual fundraiser, the Mother Day Carnation Project was entirely shut down. We were hoping that the whole effort could be moved to Father

ø Day, but the virus, as well as the authorities, had other plans. We did what we could, providing õCarnations for Mothers and Fathers on Fathers Dayö to about 30 smaller churches. But we handled only 5% of the carnation volume that we normally do on a Mother Day weekend. Unfortunately, lost revenues were still far in excess of \$10,000.

Contributions to our People for Life Education Fund on Erie Gives Day were a

major blessing, with 111 donors giving a total of \$7,845, nearly \$2,500 more than the year before.

Seven years ago, we took on a second major fundraising project: Life Run 5K/10K & Fun Walk, and now more than ever we are very glad we did. Fortunately, the impact of COVID-19 on this event was very minimal. It was a successful fundraiser, thanks to 130 registrations, a dozen \$250 sponsors, and 20 or so \$50 and \$150 sponsorships.

7th Annual Life Run

Everything about this yeargs Life Run 5K/10K & Fun Walk on October 10 was picture perfect, including the weather. Our 130 participants enjoyed mostly sunny skies and 70 degree temperatures.

We are thankful for each of our runners and walkers! We are also thankful to: Harborcreek Township and the township Supervisors for the use of the township roads and Slade Road Park; DJ (and Erie County councilman) Brian Shank for donating his excellent DJ services; Burch Farms for once again offering free wine tasting; all of our great sponsors; and all of our wonderful volunteers!

In the Women & 5K open category, Mary Jaskowak (24) of Erie took first place (and first place overall) with a time of 19:40: Helen McCormick (15) of Erie took second place with a time of 22:26; and Lauren Raimy (15) of Erie took third place with a time of 22:28. In the Menøs 5K open category, Shawn Wiler (26) of Columbus, PA took first place with a time of 19:41; Nathan Smith (14) of Harborcreek took second place with a time of 21:47; and Peter Caulfield (19) of Erie took third place with a time of 22:14.

In the Womenøs 10K open category, Bridget Fetzner (46) of Waterford took first place (and first place overall) with a time of 44:34; Theresa Hinkler (46) of Erie took second place with a time of 48:55; and Olivia Zeigler (10) of Albion took third place with a time of 52:51. In the Menøs 10K open category, John Clark (48) of Cranesville took first place with a time of 46:56; John Rowden (58) of Cambridge Springs took second place with a time of 50:32; and Rod Brest (72) of Meadville took third place with a time of 55:26.

Yard Sign Phenomenon

Our Vote Pro-Life yard signs have been a popular item lately. You may have seen some of them popping up in the Erie area.

We have been offering the red, white and blue signs since 2008. Between 2008 and 2020, we distributed about 250. This year we have distributed about 650, most of them in the last two to three months. It has been quite a phenomenon. It is a strong indication that a lot of people fully realize and have taken to heart what is at stake in the upcoming election.

It has become almost customary over the years to say that the next election will be the most important we have ever faced. But now we are witnessing pro-abortion extremists pulling out all the stops, waging war against any and all limitations on abortion and even fighting against protection for infants born alive during failed abortion attempts. At the same time, we are witnessing, in Donald Trump, the

> most pro-life president our country has ever seen.

It looks like many people are convinced that if the pro-life cause does not prevail this time around, chances of a comeback in the foreseeable future are very slim.
