March for Life in Erie with Congressman Mike Kelly!

Erieøs very first post-Roe March for Life will take place on Saturday, January 28, 2023, and for the very first time, we are going to have the honor of marching with a sitting member of Congress. U.S. Representative Mike Kelly is coming to march with us and speak during the closing program.

This will be the 46th consecutive January that People for Life and the Erie pro-life community have marched in downtown Erie on behalf of pre-born babies, their mothers, and the unalienable right to life.

Words from Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. were chosen as the theme for this years Erie March: õUnconditional love will have the final word.ö

You do not want to miss this milestone event! We need you as a voice for the voiceless. We also need you to help us welcome Congressman Kelly and express our gratitude for his consistent and passionate advocacy for the pro-life cause. Please make this Erie March for Life one of your top priorities.

Marchers are asked to arrive at the Pavilion in Perry Square by 10:45 a.m. or earlier. The March will get underway at 11 a.m. The mile-long route begins and ends at Perry Square. The walk will be followed by

a program of speakers. The entire Erie March for Life event will conclude by 12:30 p.m.

In addition to Congressman Kelly, we will hear from: second-year medical students Maia Austin and Pranuthi Gaddi, co-presidents of the Students for Life organization at LECOM; a representative from Gannon Students for Life, aka Knights for Life; and Erie County Councilman Brian Shank, who will also serve as the Erie March for Life DJ. An opening prayer will be offered by Rev. Bryan Kowalczyk, Pastor of Lake Erie Church.

Signs will be provided. Marchers are welcome to bring their own signs, but People for Life reserves the right to exclude messages that do not reflect the pro-life mission of the organization or that run counter to our philosophy or principles.

Erie weather in January can be problematic. But the March almost always goes forward, rain, snow, or sunshine. If the weather proves to be more problematic than usual and the March has to be cancelled, an announcement will be posted on peopleforlife.org and facebook.com/peopleforlife.

Please remember to dress for winter weather and be sure to use warm, non-slip footwear.

There will be lots more to tell you as January 28 approaches, so stay tuned. Additions to the program are likely. Please follow the Erie March for Life at peopleforlife.org/january2023 and subscribe to our E-Mail Updates for all the latest news.

50th March for Life Bus Trip

On January 20, 2023, pro-life Americans will gather in Washington, DC to March for Life and take a giant step into the future of pro-life activism. ŏNext Steps: Marching in a Post-Roe Americaö is the theme of this year¢s March. This will be the 50th March for Life and the first since the Dobbs decision toppled the judicial monstrosity known as Roe v. Wade. That infamous Supreme Court ruling forced practically unlimited abortion on the entire nation, resulting in 65 million lost lives.

Many of those who traveled with People for Life to the first March for Life, on January 22, 1974, are no longer with us.

Many of those who took up the March for Life tradition in the 80s and 90s are no longer up to the rigors of the red-eye bus trip and the winter chills of Washington, DC. Those of us who will be on the buses will remember those early pioneers with strong sentiments of gratitude and respect. After 50 long years, their patient dedication has carried the day. Roe is no more.

Among those to be reverently remembered is Joanne Wagner, a young mother of a large family who perished along with her preborn child in a sudden, unforeseen medical emergency while on the way to Washington with People for Life on January 22, 1976.

Joanness name appears on the list of passengers that is still displayed in our office. The late Mother Mary Beth Kennedy continued on page 2

also appears on that list. Mother õBettyö Kennedy was the beloved founder of the Community of Caring and the Community Country Day School. She was also widely admired for her work with the poor in Africa and Haiti.

The demise of Roe does not mean the end of the March for Life, although that was an important objective. Many battles at the federal level remain before us. Significantly, the terminus of the March for Life will now shift from the steps of the U.S. Supreme Court to the steps of the U.S. Capitol, where many legislative battles most surely lie ahead of us.

The March for Life Education and Defense Fund explains: õMany national legislative battles loom, including even keeping longstanding Hyde protections, which limit government funding for abortion on annual appropriation bills. The Hyde Amendment has saved over 2 million lives and is arguably the most impactful prolife policy in our nation® history, but now cannot be taken for granted. Last, our most important work is changing hearts and minds. The goal of the national March for Life is to not only change laws at the state and federal level, but to change the culture to ultimately make abortion unthinkable.ö

Bus seats are \$65 each, a price that just covers the amount we have to pay the bus company. Your payment will reserve your seat(s). There is a box on page one that shows four ways you can make a payment. Reservations will continue to be accepted until all seats are filled.

Bus number assignments, assuming there will be more than a single bus, will be listed on the front page of <u>peopleforlife.org</u> using first names and last name initials. Please check your bus number in the early evening of January 19 to save time and avoid confusion at our boarding site.

H.S. Oratory Contest

Pro-life high school students are invited to get some public speaking experience and compete for cash prizes in People for Life® annual High School Oratory Contest. The participants will experience a relaxed and friendly atmosphere at the Contest, which will be held in Erie on Saturday, April 15, 2023, tentatively at 11 a.m. The exact location is yet to be determined.

The competition is open to high school students regardless of where they live. Each contestant will gather information about a human life topic of his or her choice, write an original 5-7 minute pro-life speech, and present it before a panel of judges. Grades 9-10 and 11-12 will compete separately. A set of cash prizes will be awarded to the winners in each age group: \$100 for first place, \$50 for second, and \$25 for third.

Students may choose from a wide variety of core human life issues related to: abortion, euthanasia / assisted suicide, denial of life-saving medical treatment, exploitation of human embryos, and human cloning. Speeches may range in tone from: polemical (argumentative) to purely informative, from inspirational to provocative, from philosophical to scientific. They may address the sad or unpleasant realities that go along with the ŏculture of death,ö but there are many upbeat topics to consider as well: adoption, motherhood, pregnancy and fetal development,

The judges will score each speech and offer positive and helpful

personal experiences with pro-life

activities (e.g., the March for Life,

volunteering), and the blessings of

physical challenges such as Down

knowing people with mental or

suggestions, noting the speechoods strong points and weak points. Originality, depth of research, accuracy, careful reasoning, and delivery style will all be considered.

We are always happy to help students choose a topic and to suggest places to look for good information. Students are encouraged to choose a topic that seems interesting or one that is most relevant to their own life experiences.

Students are required to register in advance by emailing their name, age, grade, school, and phone number to <u>office@</u> peopleforlife.org.

Students may also enter the statewide PA Pro-Life Federation oratory contest by submitting a video of their speech to the Federation by April 15. People for Life will record speeches during our contest for those students who would like a copy for the statewide contest.

Open to Change

We are looking at the possibility of redirecting a portion of our fundraising efforts to something new, something less demanding of our many volunteers but more effective than some of the other projects we have been engrossed in over the years. Tradition has its place, but sometimes the time is ripe to begin a new tradition.

One option under consideration is a prolife dinner in late spring, perhaps between Mother's Day and Father's Day. Beyond raising critical funds, this kind of event would provide another opportunity to bring nationally-recognized pro-life speakers to Erie and facilitate new personal connections and friendships within the northwestern PA pro-life community. We would love to hear what you think!

Student Essay Contest

Middle school as well as high school students are invited to submit an entry in People for Life® annual Essay Contest. It is open to students in Erie, Crawford, Warren, Mercer, Venango, Ashtabula, and Chautauqua counties only. The submission deadline is April 24, 2023.

Grades 7-9 and 10-12 compete separately. Word limits are 500 for grades 7-9 and 750 for grades 10-12. As in the Oratory Contest (see above) a set of \$100,

\$10, and \$25 cash prizes will be awarded in both age groups. Essays are judged by the same criteria as the Oratory Contest speeches, but grammar, punctuation, and spelling also count.

Essays can be emailed to office@peopleforlife.org as attachments in Microsoft Word or PDF format, or placed in the body of the e-mail. They may also be mailed to People for Life; P.O. Box 1126; Erie, PA 16512, postmarked no later than April 24. All entries must include the student@name, address, phone number, age, grade, and school.

Bus Trip Sponsors

Even if you will not be able to go to Washington, DC for the March for Life this month, you can give someone else a chance to march for the babies and their mothers by being a March for Life Bus Trip sponsor.

Each bus seat costs \$65, but even a partial sponsorship would help conserve money for meals and Metro fare. The Metro costs between \$9 and \$15 depending on what a marcher group decides to do before the March begins at noon.

We were not even sure, a few months ago, that there would be a March for Life Bus Trip this year, because of a dramatic increase in the cost of bus transportation. The cost per seat jumped from an already pricey \$60 a seat to an even more prohibitive \$80 a seat. We published a plea for help in the November issue of this newsletter, and three very kind and generous people came forward with donations sufficient to offset the big price increase for two buses.

Even \$65 can be prohibitive for college students and families with several children, as well as for others. We must continue our custom of accepting sponsorship donations to help deserving individuals and families

on a case by case basis. Your generous support will help us put as many Erie-area marchers on the streets of Washington, DC as we possibly can.

45th Annual Pro-Life Breakfast



SPECIAL GUEST SPEAKER

Our Special Guest Speaker is Patricia Sandoval. She will share perhaps the most remarkable and moving story ever heard at our annual gathering.

Patricias life as a second-generation Mexican-American began in a happy, sheltered family environment, but problems developed and her family eventually unraveled.

At 19, she found a boyfriend and soon became pregnant. She decided to have an abortion. Her sixth-grade teacher had explained that abortion is a womanøs right and that õltøs not a baby until the fifth month.ö

Nevertheless, Patricia left the abortion facility feeling empty. She soon began to experience nightmares. Seeing small children would upset her. She became emotional, getting angry or sad for the slightest reason.

She became pregnant again, this time sneaking off to Planned Parenthood for another abortion without telling her boyfriend. She began to feel self-loathing and became

suicidal. Her anxiety deepened and she developed eating disorders. These are all classic symptoms of post-abortion syndrome (PAS), but Patricia had not yet connected the dots. She assumed her fragile emotional condition was entirely due to the breakup of her family. The worst was yet to come.

There was a third pregnancy and a third abortion, despite her boyfriendøs pleas that she not go through with it.

After moving to Sacramento, Patricia learned that Planned Parenthood needed a bilingual nurse. She applied for the job but explained that she was not actually a nurse. They hired her anyway.

Patricia® testimony confirms that everything we have heard about Planned Parenthood is true: õWorking behind the doors of a clinic is a step away from hell! I saw women screaming while our staff dragged them down hallways. I wanted to ask, \exists snøt anybody else horrified?øBut they had no expression; they worked like robots, traumatized by the abortions.ö

One day, Patricia saw a girl come in for an abortion, six months pregnant. She was carrying twins. It was time for Patricia to get of there.

Next, she began doing drugs and soon lost everything, including her boyfriend. Patricia spent three years wandering the streets as a hopeless and homeless drug addict.

That this story came to a happy ending might seem truly miraculous, but it did. Patricia will share that part of her story, as well.

Today, Patricia is an international prolife speaker who shares her story around the world. She currently hosts a weekly television program, õPro-Life Report,ö on EWTN Español. Her biography, *Transfigured*, is highly acclaimed and has been translated into several languages. One of the bookøs endorsements comes from the heroically pro-life Archbishop of San Francisco, Salvator Cordileone: õThis well-written book is always engaging and has something to challenge and inspire each of us, particularly in support of Godøs littlest ones, the unborn.ö

Copies of *Transfigured* will be available to purchase after the Pro-Life Breakfast. Patricia will be on-hand to sign each copy.
