Erie Marches for Life Despite the Lockdowns

The Erie March for Life this past January 23 was an unqualified success! As we take a quick look back to January, let's all start thinking about how we can make our January 2022 Erie March for Life even bigger and better.

Over 250 people participated. Some came from as far away as Meadville and Conneaut Lake.

The attendance was surprisingly strong considering the frigid temperatures and the number of people who understandably stayed home out of caution over COVID-19. Our advertising was somewhat less ambitious this year, too, because of the uncertainties arising from COVID-19 including the need to proceed without the usual City of Erie special events permit.

The City was not issuing any special events permits because of the virus. This limited us to marching on the sidewalks rather than on the streets as usual.

Here are some previous Erie March for Life attendance numbers: (2020 was canceled due to an ice storm.); 2019/205; 2018/220; 2017/350 (The Trump inauguration generated some extra excitement.); 2016/160; 2015/95 (single digit temperatures; 20 of these rode in

their cars.); 2014/200; 2013/300. As you can see, the 2021 attendance was not at all disappointing. It was a good sign that, although we are deeply disappointed by the loss of the White House, we are not about to give up.

People for Life thanks everyone who participated, including the Gannon Students for Life, the Knights of Columbus, and especially our speakers: Rev. Michael Taylor, pastor of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church in Albion; Melanie Brewer, on behalf of Congressman Mike Kelly; Brian Shank, Erie County 5th District Councilman (Thanks, Brian for letting us use your bullhorn.); Aidan Kerlin, President of Gannon Students for Life; Rachel Praetzel, Vice President of Administration, Gannon Students for Life; and Sheila Barajas, a first generation Mexican-American with years of experience in counseling women considering abortion and other facets of pro-life activism in California. Sheila's father was an immigrant from Mexico who served in the United States Marine Corps.

The program was MC'd by People for Life Executive Director Tim Broderick.

College student participation was down this year because of a later than normal post-

holiday resumption of classes. Mercyhurst University students, who usually attend in rather large numbers, were among those who had not yet returned from their holiday break.

Canceled January Events

Unfortunately, the 43rd Annual Pro-Life Breakfast, originally scheduled for January 16, then tentatively rescheduled for April 24, had to be completely cancelled due to Pennsylvania's COVID-19 restrictions. The good news is that Rachel Bovard, who was to be our 2021 special guest speaker, is going to join us at the Bayfront Convention Center for the 2022 Pro-Life Breakfast on January 15.

Our annual March for Life Bus Trip met a similar fate. The trip had to be called off just six days before our scheduled departure for Washington, when the March for Life itself was cancelled (except for a small march by a token group of pro-life leaders). By that time, every other bus from northwestern Pennsylvania had already been canceled and we were fielding reservations from as far away as Titusville and Grove City.

High School Oratory Contest

Two \$100 first prizes were awarded to the winners of this year's High School Oratory Contest, held on April 10. Sadly, there were no takers for the second and third place prizes in either of the two contest levels. We will chalk it up to the lingering effects of COVID-19 and hope for a bigger field of contestants next year.

Our two winners were entirely deserving of their first place honors. In the 11-12 grade contest, the winner was Thomas Caulfield, age 17. Thomas spoke about the lies and deceptions that form the underpinnings of Roe v. Wade and the entire pro-abortion movement. He advised us to face our pro-abortion opponents with courage and confidence because our position is based firmly on sound logic and scientific realities,

while theirs is based on lies and propaganda fabricated to reach a predetermined conclusion. In the 9-10 grade contest, our winner, Clare Caulfield, age 15, spoke about Margaret Sanger, the founder of Planned Parenthood and the racist roots of her organization. Clare argued that despite Planned Parenthood's recently distancing itself from its racist-eugenicist founder, its exploitation of the Black community and other minorities continues unabated.

Must-See: *Fatal Flaws*

Attendees at a recent People for Life meeting had an opportunity to view the documentary film, *Fatal Flaws*. This top-notch documentary was produced by the Euthanasia Prevention Coalition, based in London, Ontario. It addresses the question, "Are laws

allowing euthanasia and assisted suicide leading society down a dangerous path?"

The producer introduces the film this way: "A thought-provoking journey through Europe and North America to ask one of the most fundamental philosophical questions of our time: should we be giving doctors the right in law to end the life of others by euthanasia or assisted suicide? Filmmaker Kevin Dunn uses powerful testimonies and expert opinion from both sides of the issue to uncover how these highly disputed laws affect society over time."

This film needs to be seen by as wide an audience as possible. The DVD is available to watch here at People for Life or to be borrowed for home viewing.

Candidate Survey for the May 18, 2021 Primary Election

1. LEGAL PROTECTION If changes to the Roe v. Wade decision make it possible, would you approve or disapprove of a law prohibiting abortion except when necessary to prevent the death of the mother or prohibiting abortion with additional exceptions? (Please specify what additional exceptions, if any.)

2. LATE TERM ABORTIONS Should abortions be prohibited in all cases where the unborn child is mature enough to survive apart from his or her mother (approximately 22 weeks from conception)?

3. INFORMED CONSENT Do you approve of the provisions of the Pennsylvania Abortion Control Act that require abortion providers to offer basic information to a woman who is considering an abortion, including information about medical risks, alternatives to abortion, the

probable gestational age of the unborn child, the availability of detailed information (provided by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania) about

fetal development, and the possibility of medical assistance benefits if the woman decides to continue her pregnancy?

4. WAITING PERIODS Do you approve of the provision of the Pennsylvania Abortion Control Act that requires a 24 hour waiting period, after a woman who is considering abortion has consulted with a physician and been given the information noted in Question 3 above, to allow the woman time to carefully consider her decision, before an abortion is carried out?

5. PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT Do you approve of the provision of the Pennsylvania Abortion Control Act that requires the consent of at least one parent if the person seeking an abortion is less than 18 years old, unless a judge determines that extenuating circumstances are involved?

Chuck Nelson ♦ 1 Approve with additional exceptions ♦ 2 Without room for exceptions, I do not offer an answer. My concern is with viability. I have counseled situations where the child may be mature but not viable. ♦ 8 I do not offer an answer.

Brian Shank ♦ 1 In case of rape.

None of the Democratic candidates returned a questionnaire, but Democrats can still vote for pro-life candidates by writing-in any of the candidates mentioned above.
