Midterm Elections 2026

Primary Election Day in Pennsylvania is Tuesday, May 19. Here is what to know about the candidates who will be on the ballot in northwestern Pennsylvania.

Governor / Lt. Governor

In the race for governor, incumbent Josh Shapiro is unopposed in the Democratic primary. If Shapiro tells you he is for "reproductive rights," rest assured that he means it very sincerely. One of his first projects as governor was to spend tax dollars on a "You have the right to choose in Pennsylvania" website to steer Pennsylvania women to abortion facilities. Shapiro also ended funding for pregnancy support centers. A member of the Reproductive Freedom Alliance, a group of more than 20 pro-abortion governors, Shapiro advocates for Medicaid-funded abortions and pledges to veto any legislation that might impede unlimited "reproductive rights." Challenger Stacy Garrity is unopposed in the Republican primary. Garrity takes a strong pro-life position, a position she also held as state treasurer and a gubernatorial candidate in 2022.

In the race for lieutenant governor, incumbent Austin Davis is unopposed in the Democratic primary. Davis is a member of a coalition of pro-abortion lieutenant governors. He applauds Governor Shapiro's vow to veto any and all pro-life legislation.

he has been endorsed previously by Planned Parenthood, the nation's largest abortion provider and one of its biggest promoters.

Two republicans are running for lieutenant governor in the primary election. Both Jason Richey and Austin Davis take a pro-life position.

U.S. House of Representatives

In the 16th Congressional District, pro-life incumbent Mike Kelly is unopposed in the Republican primary and Jason Wagner is unopposed in the Democratic primary. Read more about this race on the following page.

PA General Assembly

In state Senate District 50, incumbent state Senator Michele Brooks is unchallenged and on the ballot in the Republican primary. She has a long and consistent pro-life record and is outspokenly pro-life. There are no candidates in the Democratic primary.

Democrats Pat Harkins and Robert Merski, the incumbent representatives in state House districts 1 and 2, respectively, are unchallenged. Harkins and Merski are pro-abortion. They recently voted for HB 1957, which would enshrine abortion-until-birth in the state constitution.

In state House District 3, pro-abortion Ryan Bizarro is unopposed in the Democratic primary. Bizarro voted for HB 1957 the pro-abortion constitutional

amendment. In 2024, Bizarro was endorsed by the pro-abortion Pennsylvania National Organization for Women and VotePro Choice.us. Donna Rae Reese is running unopposed in the Republican primary. She takes a pro-life position.

In state House District 4, pro-life Jake Banta is unopposed in the Republican primary. Kathryn Divittorio, a former Corry Area school director, is running unopposed in the Democratic primary. Her position on human life issues is unknown at this time.

In state House District 6, incumbent Brad Roae is unopposed in the Republican primary. Roae has a long and consistent pro-life record and is outspokenly pro-life. Michael Walker is running unopposed in the Democratic primary. He ran against Roae in 2024 and was identified as pro-abortion by the PA Pro-Life Federation PA at that time.

In state House District 7, pro-life Republican Parke Wentling is unchallenged.

In state House District 65, incumbent Kathy Rapp is unopposed in the Republican primary. She has a long and consistent pro-life record and has been a top pro-life leader in the PA House. Destiny Howard, 27, is running unopposed in the Democratic primary. She is presenting herself as a strong supporter of HB 1957. Her Facebook profile features an unfortunate collection of pro-abortion opinions and cliches.

Also speaking that morning were: Congressman Mike Kelly, Catholic Bishop Lawrence Persico, state Representative Brad Roae, Slippery Rock Mayor JD Longo, and Gannon Students for Life President Clare Caulfield. Prayers to open and close the event were offered by Rev. Clifford Hamilton (East Erie Assembly of God) and Fr. Ian McElrath (St. Hedwig and Mercyhurst Prep), respectively. State Senator Scott Hutchinson

and state Representative Parke Wentling were also in attendance.

Congressional Race

The campaign for U.S. Representative in Pennsylvania’s 16th District will be a race between a pro-life, eight-term incumbent, Republican Mike Kelly, and challenger Justin Wagner, a Democrat. The two candidates are a study in contrasts.

Mr. Wagner is a zealous abortion advocate. His website has a lengthy “Defend the Right to Bodily Autonomy” section where Wagner pledges to be “a fierce defender of reproductive rights.” He wants to codify *Roe v. Wade* by enacting the *Women’s Health Protection Act*, which would make abortion legal throughout all nine months of pregnancy in all 50 states. He would fight to end the Hyde Amendment, which prevents taxpayer dollars from paying for Medicaid abortions and has saved at least 2.6 million lives since 1976. Wagner also wants to make sure the mifepristone

Election Meeting

The annual election meeting of People for Life is scheduled for 6:30 p.m. on Monday, June 1, 2026. It will be held at People for Life headquarters, 1625 W. 26th St., Erie. The nominees are: Tim Broderick, President; Carol Struchen, treasurer; Megan Bonk, secretary; Gretchen Lorei, first vice president; Dale Klobusnik, second vice president; and Karli Van Der Volgen, third vice president.

Additional nominations will be accepted from the floor with the permission of the nominee, who must be a current member and have been actively engaged in the organization for at least the previous 12 months. Only individuals whose dues are paid one month in advance of the meeting are eligible to vote.

Pro-Abortion Amendment

HB 1957 is the first step toward enshrining unlimited abortion throughout pregnancy in the Pennsylvania constitution. You may recall that the state House passed the bill by a vote of 102-101, with all but two Democrats voting pro-abortion and all but one Republican voting pro-life. Please also remember that the following three Erie-area state representatives voted for HB 1957 —

for unlimited abortion killing, even in the ninth month of pregnancy.

- ✘ Patrick Harkins (District 1)
- ✘ Robert Merski (District 2)
- ✘ Ryan Bizzarro (District 3)

HB 1957 is now before the state Senate. It is one of seven bills written by House Democrats to destroy every last vestige of protection for unborn children and their mothers in the Commonwealth. The other six bills were reported out of committee on straight party-line votes but are still awaiting floor action in the state House.

3rd Annual Fall Dinner

People for Life's Fall Educational Dinner will be held on Friday, October 23 at a new location, the Colony Banquet Center, 3014 W. 12th St., Erie. We will have a buffet meal featuring three entrées, music, and a cash bar. Special Guest Speaker Katie McMahon, will address a difficult topic that is often misunderstood and the ramifications of which are not always fully considered.

As someone who struggled with infertility for 20 years and has two children conceived through IVF, Katie understands the necessity for sensitivity and compassion when these important topics are discussed.

Having given birth to two wonderful children with the help of IVF, Katie nevertheless began to have second thoughts

about the procedure. What to do with her and her husband's four remaining embryos in cryogenic preservation became a troubling question. They struggled with the idea of embryo adoption, where the embryonic children would be donated to one or more women who would proceed with implantation and gestation and, if successful, raise the embryo, or embryos, as their own children.

Ultimately, two of Katie's four remaining embryos were implanted in her own womb but miscarried. Her other two embryos did not survive the thawing process.

Marchers should arrive at Perry Square in downtown Erie by 10:45 a.m. to get organized. The Erie March for Life will step off at 11 a.m., traveling west on 6th Street, south on Sassafras, east on 10th Street, and north on State back to Perry Square. The route is just over a mile long. Supervision and security will be provided by the City of Erie Police Department. The marchers will reassemble in Perry Square to hear a number local and regional pro-life leaders, including: U.S. Representative Mike Kelly, 6th District state Representative Brad Roae, Slippery Rock Mayor J.D. Longo, Doctor Jeffrey McGovern, and Gannon Students for Life President Clare Caulfield. A message from U.S. Senator Dave McCormick will be conveyed by his Regional Director Sheila Sterrett. Reverend Al Detter, a former Senior Pastor of Grace Church in McKean, has kindly agreed to open the

program with a prayer. The event is expected to conclude by 12:30 p.m.

Signs with thoughtful, constructive messages, the kind that might touch a few minds and hearts, are always welcome. Signs will be available to borrow, also.

The Erie March for Life was traditionally held in January it was moved to May in 2024. The May temperatures are a big improvement, but Erie weather can be full of surprises.
